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## Double Easel Fun Fold Tutorial



### Supplies Needed:

Lost Lagoon, Pretty Peacock, Basic White cardstock  
Winter Meadow DSP  
Graceful Greenery vellum  
Filled With Cheer stamps  
Merriest Trees, Spotlight on Nature dies  
Black ink

Versamark  
White embossing powder  
Stampin' Blends  
Transparent dots  
Wink of Stella  
Dimensionals  
Adhesives

## General Measurements:

Card base	11" x 4 ¼" scored at 5 ½"
Easel panel	11" x 4" scored at 5 ¼" and 8 ⅜"
DSP	3 7/8" x 5 1/8" 2 ½" x 3 7/8" 7/8" x 3 7/8"
Trees	4 ¼" x 11"
Image panel	4 ¼" x 5 ½"
Sentiment panel	2" x 2"

## Directions:

1. Cut Lost Lagoon cardstock 11" x 4 ¼". Score at 5 ½".
2. Cut Pretty Peacock cardstock 11" x 4". Set the remaining portion aside. Score at 5 ¼" and 8 ⅜". Fold on the score lines so that the 5 ¼" panel is the back panel and the 3 7/8" panel folds up to create the smallest easel on the card front.
3. Adhere the Pretty Peacock panel to the Lost Lagoon card base.
4. Select the small tree pattern sheet from the Winter Meadow designer series paper pack. Cut a 3 7/8" strip from the 12x12 sheet. Then cut 3 panels ensuring that the tree pattern runs in the portrait orientation:
  - a. 3 7/8" x 5 1/8"
  - b. 3 7/8" x 2 ½"
  - c. 3 7/8" x 7/8"
5. Next, you will adhere these panels to the Pretty Peacock panel. Spread out the Pretty Peacock layer. Adhere piece (a) to the largest section of the Pretty Peacock mat on the card front.
6. Fold up the Pretty Peacock panel to create the easel so that it is laying flat on the full card front. Adhere (b) to the exposed panel facing out.
7. With the full card front lying flat, flip up the bottom panel to which you just adhered (b). This exposes the panel underneath. Adhere (c) to the bottom of this panel so that when all panels are lying flat, the small tree pattern appears to cover the entire card front.

8. Using the half sheet of Pretty Peacock cut earlier, arrange all 5 of the tree dies from Merriest Trees on the cardstock on the cutting surface and run through the die cutting machine. Set aside the largest tree.
9. Apply a single layer of dimensionals to the back of each of the remaining 4 trees. On the bottom edge of each tree, apply 2 layers of dimensionals.
10. Begin applying the trees in layers over the largest tree beginning with the largest of the 4 remaining trees and working to the smallest. Each layer will stick up a little higher than the layer below. When complete, you have one full tree.
11. Cover each of the tree layer edges with Wink of Stella.
12. Apply adhesive to about half of the back of the tree and then adhere to the left side of smaller easel panel of the card front.
13. Using a quarter sheet of white cardstock with the 4 ¼" edge at the bottom, stamp the snowman image from the Filled With Cheer stamp set in black ink in the center of the sheet toward the bottom edge. You'll want to leave enough at the bottom to be able to apply dimensionals on the back.
14. Using paper snips, cut around the image so that you only have the snowman remaining. Remember to leave a strip at the bottom wide enough to apply dimensionals on the back.
15. Using Stampin' Blends, color the hat, scarf, and nose of the snowman.
16. Apply dimensionals to the back of the snowman and adhere in front of the tree. It will be necessary to apply multiple layers of dimensionals in some places in order to adhere the snowman on a single plane. Trim any overhanging portions of white cardstock as needed.
17. Cut a 2" x 2" piece of snowy vellum from the Graceful Greenery vellum pack. Diecut a small circle using the Spotlight on Nature dies.
18. Stamp "a warm hello" sentiment from the Filled With Cheer stamp set in Versamark ink. Cover with white embossing powder and heat emboss.
19. Affix the sentiment panel to top right of the card (when looking at the card with all layers lying flat) front using dimensionals. Cover the dimensionals with transparent dots.
20. Embellish with other transparent dots as desired.
